Hello everyone!

As Fr. Hite and I were walking through the church last week to check the progress of our restoration project, we both noted how wonderful it is to have all of our beautiful stained-glass windows back in place. I am willing to guess that everyone would agree with us! Truly, we are very blessed to have a lot of beautiful artwork in the church. Of course, the purpose of having beautiful art in the church is to help us pray and meditate on the rich mysteries of our faith and on the lives of the saints. Many of the larger windows in our church contain depictions of the various mysteries of the rosary, which are always meditations on the life of Christ. Additionally, with the majority of these windows cleaned, the vibrant colors enliven the images, allowing us to enter into these mysteries all the more.

I mention the images on the windows because October has traditionally been considered the "month of the rosary" since Pope Pius V instituted the feast day of Our Lady of Victory in the late 1500's. His successor, Gregory XIII adjusted the name to Our Lady of the Rosary. Today's date, October 7, has marked the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary since that time.

In accord with today's feast day, I invite everyone to consider taking up this beautiful devotion to Mary. Not only is it a great way to meditate on the life of Christ, it is also a means to ask Mary for her powerful prayers for ourselves and for others as well. Mary's protection is so strong that St. Pio (a.k.a. Padre Pio) often advised those who sought his spiritual counsel to "Love the Madonna and pray the rosary, for her rosary is the weapon against the evils of the world today." Indeed, today's world very much needs Mary's prayers and protection!

New to the rosary? No problem; it is fairly easy to learn and the "how-to" information can easily be found on the internet (We can also help you in the parish office!). Another option would be to find a friend who knows, and ask to join them in praying the rosary. Either way, praying the rosary is always an opportunity to come to know Christ better, because Mary always desires to bring us closer to him.

**175<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY NOTES**



When Father Andrew Magenann, St. Peter's fourth resident Pastor, resigned at the end of 1897, Cleveland Bishop Ignatius Horstmann appointed Father Ferdinand A. Schreiber as the fifth pastor of St. Peter's Parish in early January of 1898.

Ferdinand A. Schreiber was born in Callicoon (or Jeffersonville), New York (near the Pennsylvania state line northeast of Scranton and south of the Catskills) on July 3, 1861. He was the son of Carl and Apolonia (née Guenther) Schreiber. His parents were natives of Baden, Germany and they emigrated to the U.S. as children. In 1863, the Schreibers moved to Scranton, where they enrolled their son in the parochial school at St. Mary of the Assumption Church. At the conclusion of his elementary education, young Ferdinand was sent to St. Vincent Preparatory College in Latrobe, Pennsylvania. He also completed his collegiate and minor seminary education there. Ferdinand's priestly formation and studies were completed at St. Mary's Theological Seminary in Cleveland.

Ferdinand Schreiber was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Cleveland on his birthday, July 3, 1886 by Cleveland Bishop Richard Gilmour. His first assignment after ordination was as Pastor of St. Mary's Church in Antwerp (near the Ohio Indiana border southwest of Toledo). During his time as Pastor at Antwerp, he also served the mission churches in Paulding and Defiance Counties, in little towns like Payne, Latty, Cecil, Junction, Hicksville and Delaware Bend. He built churches in Latty and Cecil during his years there.

In 1890, Father Schreiber was appointed Pastor of Sacred Heart Church at Bethlehem (Shelby Settlement). He served there until his appointment to St. Peter's in 1898. During his time as Pastor at the Settlement he oversaw the construction of the present church there which was built between 1891 and 1895. A plaque with that information can be found in the vestibule of that church.

In early 1898, Father Schreiber was assigned to St. Peter's Parish in Mansfield. When he arrived, the parish was still struggling under the weight of an enormous residual debt from the disastrous fire and consequent construction of the third church. He set about immediately to reduce the debt and, within five years, he erased the debt altogether.

In the next column, we will examine Father Schreiber's ministry and work in our parish, including the construction of the present St. Peter's Church.
