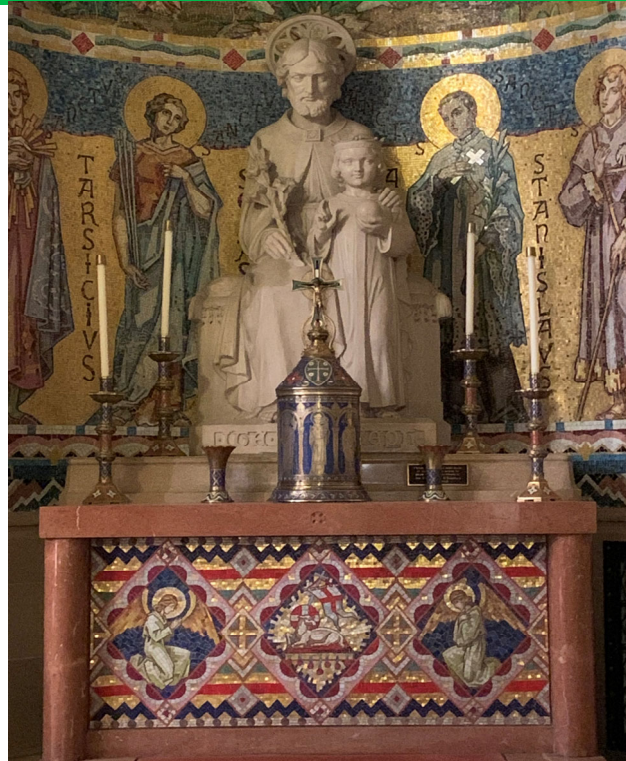

Here are the last test scores of the year. The children completed these tests in April/ May. The RIT score is the typical score expected for matching peers within the norms study. These tests are required by Toledo Diocese.

Summary of MAP test Diocesan results:

First, I am thrilled with our science results. In grades 3-6, we scored above the National average in all grades tested. (We only start testing science in 3rd grade)

3 rd grade- our RIT Mean score	200.2	National RIT	195.4
4 th grade- our RIT Mean score	203.4	National RIT	201.0
5 th grade-our RIT Mean score	206.7	National RIT	205.7
6 th grade-our RIT Mean score	217.7	National RIT	208.6

Math seems to be our weakest area. We adopted a new curriculum this year and need continual work.

Our ACRE, 5th grade religion test, which all students Catholic and Non-Catholic take is administered once a year. Here are the results:

Part one is "Faith Knowledge"=75 % of our students scored proficient to advanced.

Pillar one-Profession of Faith (Creed) - our group average score-73.3%
National average score-70%

Pillar two-Liturgy and Sacraments-our group average score-70.9 %
National average score-68%

Pillar three- Life in Christ-our group average score-69.2%
National average score-72%

Pillar four-Christian Prayer-our group average score-67.8%
National average score-65%.

Here in our State legislature on June 5, House Bill 136 passed 76 to 17, banning executions of people with 'serious mental illness' at time of crime. This bill now goes to the Ohio Senate for consideration. On May 30 the State of New Hampshire became the 21st state to abolish the death penalty.

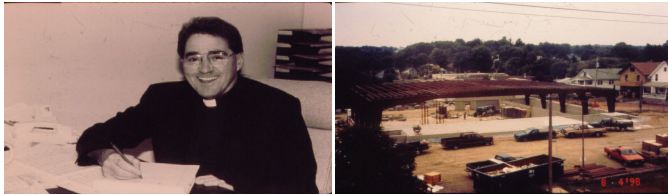

ACTING PRINCIPAL'S NAMED



Very Reverend Gregory R. Hite, Pastor of St. Peter's Catholic Church and Local Superintendent of St. Peter's School, Mansfield, has recently appointed two new leaders for the parochial school system.

Ashley Rastorfer, currently Director of the Montessori and Assistant Elementary Principal, will become the Acting Principal of St. Peter's School, Montessori through grade 6. She has been associated with the St. Peter's School system since 2013, serving as an elementary teacher in pre-school, kindergarten, third and fourth grades. Mrs. Rastorfer earned her Master of Education in Administration from Ashland University and holds a Professional Early Childhood (P-3) Teaching License and a Professional Principal License (PK-6) in the State of Ohio. She is also an adjunct instructor at Ashland University's College of Education.

Jonathan R. Cuttitta, Dean of Students at St. Peter's High School since 2014, will become the Acting Principal of St. Peter's High School and Junior High, grades 7 through 12. He has been on staff at St. Peter's since 2012, teaching Physics, Chemistry, Algebra 2 and Pre-Algebra. Mr. Cuttitta earned his Master of Education in Educational Leadership from the American College of Education and holds a Professional Adolescence to Young Adult (7-12) Teaching License and a Professional Principal License (5-12) in the State of Ohio.

Both acting principals will officially begin duties on August 1, 2019.

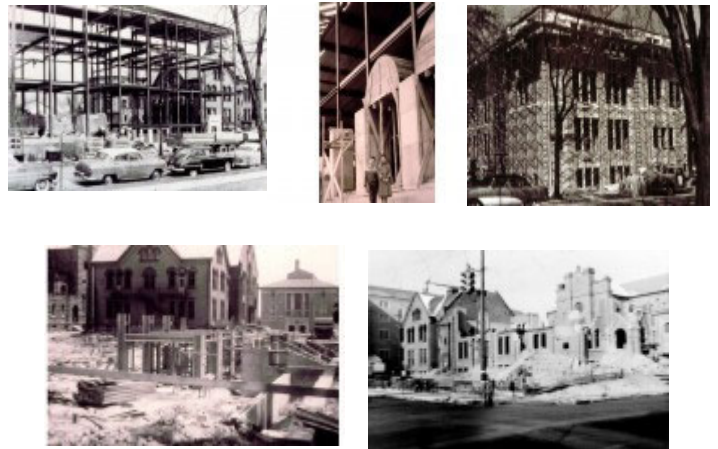

175TH ANNIVERSARY NOTES

In our last column we learned about the arrival of Monsignor James Hebbeler in our parish. Recall that he broke ground for the new High School building less than a year after his appointment as Pastor. Monsignor Hebbeler was helped significantly by the groundwork laid out by his predecessor, Monsignor Rupert Goebel.

Construction began immediately and the entire steel framework of the building was standing by early 1957. The land purchased by the Parish for the school site cost \$30,000 and the construction of the High School ended up costing 2.25 million dollars. Nowadays you wouldn't be able to lay the foundation of our high school building for that amount of money.

The new High School opened in September of 1958 with an enrollment of 349 students. The building was blessed by Toledo Bishop George Rehring on November 9, 1958. Once the new building was open and operational, the previous school/church building dating from 1889/1890 was razed. In addition, since the top two floors of the new school building were designed to serve as the convent for the Franciscan Sisters, the old "House of Seven Gables," as the previous convent/residence of the sisters was called, was also razed. These developments allowed for new and larger parking areas for the growing parish and school.

The advent of a new school building with all the bells and whistles (or what passed for bells and whistles in 1958), including a new gymnasium and auditorium, meant that St. Peter's School had the facilities and resources to develop a diverse athletic program. Monsignor Hebbeler, himself an accomplished athlete in his youth, was committed to the establishment of a quality athletic program. Within ten years of the completion of construction on the school, Monsignor Hebbeler's vision for a successful athletic program was realized when the St. Peter's Spartans Boys Basketball Team won a state championship in 1968. We will continue our look at the pastorate of Monsignor Hebbeler in the next issue of the bulletin.

THIS IS THE HOLY TRINITY

Today we celebrate the Holy Trinity, one of the most confounding mysteries of our faith. Through this mystery we experience our relationship to God: Creator, Savior, and Holy Spirit. This relationship is not easy to understand or to describe. It does not become clearer through analysis. Its complexity mirrors the complexity of all our relationships. We understand our relationships with our spouses, our children, our parents, and our friends only through daily give-and-take, annual rituals, and the life-changing moments we share. We understand our relationships only as we live them. The relationships we have with those we love, and who love us, sustain us through an uncertain and difficult life. This is the Holy Trinity.

What is striking about today's readings is that each is incomplete. What they do offer is a description of a moment in our relationship, a memory of a time and an event when our relationship made sense even though that sense may be beyond our ability to describe fully. Often that is all that our faith offers, that is, a memory of what is possible, what is promised, what has been given. A memory of eternity, of love beyond understanding is to be cherished and nurtured even if not fully understood. This is the Holy Trinity.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today's feast, extending a dimension of Easter joy into Ordinary Time, reminds us that every aspect of worship centers on the mystery of God in three persons. At baptism, we are initiated into Christ *and* the Spirit. The Creed we recite at Mass every Sunday has its roots in the ancient celebration of baptism, when a new believer was questioned at the edge of the waters of the font with three questions: Do you believe in God, the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit? Three questions, three affirmations, three immersions into the saving waters. Because every liturgy abounds with references to the Trinity, not only in words but in blessings by the sign of the cross, this feast was not easily accepted into the calendar. Pope Alexander in the eleventh century remarked that the liturgy is so laden with praise of the Trinity that there was no need for a special feast. Two hundred years later, while in exile in France, Pope John XXII proclaimed the feast, but it was not until 1911 that Pope St. Pius X gave it status as a solemnity.

A favorite image in art for today is the Icon of the Trinity, showing three glorious winged men seated at a table laden with bread and a cup of wine. It recalls Abraham's hospitality to angels and gives expression to the inner life of God, a life lived in relationship, a life poured out in abundance whenever Christians gather at the table of the Eucharist to give praise to the Father, in Christ, in the embrace of the Spirit.
